# **Education Services**

Federal laws ensure that a child with a disability or special health care need receives a free and appropriate public education.

- Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA)
- Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973

If you know or suspect a child three years of age or above has a disability, contact your local public school to request a free evaluation.

If you are concerned that an infant or toddler has a developmental delay, contact the statewide <u>Birth to Three Connections</u> program at (800) 305-3064 to request a free screening.

# **Tips to Help Reduce Pharmacy Expense**

- Let your health provider/pharmacist know if pharmacy costs are a hardship so they may help you find affordable alternatives and programs.
- Finding the drug discount card or coupon for greatest savings is a matter of trial and error but worthwhile.
- Apply for financial assistance programs offered by the pharmaceutical company that manufactures your child's medication.
- Ask your health provider to write a prescription for items your child needs from the pharmacy.
   Private insurance or discount cards/coupons may then apply, and you may be exempt from sales taxes.
- Check with pharmacies for saving cards or rewards programs that offer rebates or discounts for your continued business.
